General Public: \$4.00

- Elderly/Disabled (Half price fare will be applied to those individuals 65 years of age or older or those having a Disabled Reduced Fare Application (PDF) on file)
- All fares are for a one-way passenger trip. Drivers ONLY carry \$10.00 and don't always have change. Please try to have the correct change if possible.

Children

- All children under 5 years of age ride free when accompanied by an adult.
- Fares for children ages 5-17 are \$1.00 each with a paying adult.
- Kids 10+ that ride alone cost \$1.00 per ride.

Spirit Medical Transport

- Patients can get free rides to medical appointments if they are in a wheelchair or ambulatory after an application (application through JFS).
- Patients who need to be transported on a stretcher must be on the Area of Aging Passport program.
- Patients may also use Spirit medical for Emergency Room Transportation.
